



ENTER YOUR SKILLS CHALLENGE TO WIN A PRIZE WHSI EUSTORY PRIZE

Welsh Heritage Schools Initiative (WHSI) is a member of EUSTORY, a network of organisations across Europe that organise research-based history competitions for young people over the age of 16.

In Wales, WHSI organizes an annual competition that encourages young people to undertake an individual enquiry linked to Welsh heritage. A prize of £200 will be awarded to the top two entries (£100 to the student and £100 to the school).

In addition, five entrants can be put forward to attend the annual Eustory campus, at which students from

across Europe join together to undertake a range of activities. This event is usually held in a European city, although in recent years it has been organized on a virtual format due to the current situation.

The Skills Challenge Certificate

A number of the Skills Challenge Certificate Community Challenges are closely related to Welsh heritage. WHSI considers that work submitted by students for several of the challenges would be appropriate for entering the WHSI EUSTORY competition, with a short introduction.

Skills Challenge Certificate Challenges that would meet WHSI EUSTORY requirements.

Candidates who undertake the **Community Challenge -**



History Walking Tours are eligible to enter the WHSI Eustory Competition.

- 1 Submit the details of your walking tour.
- 2 Provide a short report (approx. 500 words) that
 - a) Describes the research that you have undertaken in order to create your walking tour, and
 - b) Explains how your walking tour contributes to participants understanding of their local history and heritage.

Candidates who undertake the **Cadw Community Challenge - Take over the Museum** are eligible to enter the WHSI Eustory Competition.



- 1 Submit the activities and materials that you have created for your takeover day.
- 2 Provide a short report (approx. 500 words) that
 - a) Describes the research that you have undertaken in order to create your activities and materials, and
 - b) Explains how the undertaking of your activities will help participants gain a greater understanding of their history and heritage.

Candidates who undertake the **Amgueddfa**



Cymru/National Museum of Wales Community Challenge - Telling Stories are eligible to enter the WHSI Eustory Competition.

- 1 Submit details of the story that you have developed and the activities and materials that you have created.
- 2 Provide a short report (approx. 500 words) that
 - a) Describes the research that you have undertaken in order to create your story telling session, activities and materials, and
 - b) Explain how participation in your story telling sessions will help individuals gain a greater understanding of their history and heritage.
